Designed for nurses, social workers and physicians who must attend training as a condition of licensure per M.G.L. c. 112, § 264.

Overview

This MDPH approved course meets the training requirement for health care providers on the issue of domestic and sexual violence as a condition of licensure (M.G.L. c. 112, § 264). This training seeks to provide comprehensive education on domestic and sexual violence so health care providers will be better equipped to intervene in a trauma-informed, abuse-aware fashion in circumstances of chronic violence or abuse.

Objectives: As a result of participating in this workshop, learners will increase their ability to:

- Recognize violence and abuse across the lifespan;
- Recognize barriers to leaving an abuse dynamic;
- Build an architecture for universal education;
- Recognize the overlap between different forms of abuse in a family system;
- Document so as to decrease sanctuary harm and increase survivor safety;
- Intervene appropriately; and
- Incorporate an understanding of historical and other forms of trauma into daily practice.
